90. 0 ANNUAL UAS MEETING HELD IN SALT LAKE CITY. May 16 was the date of the Fifteenth Annual Symposium on the Archaeology of the Scriptures. " It was held in Salt Lake City at the Senior Citizens Recreation Center, 237 South 10th East Street.

The annual meeting was co-sponsored this year as usual by the UAS and the BYU Department of Archaeology. The Salt Lake Chapter of the Society, with Darrell R. Tondro as director, assisted with arrangements. (The Annual Symposium is normally held on the BYU campus in Provo.)

Thirteen papers were read before the day-long convention as follows: A. Richards Durham, "Antiquity, Scholarship, and the Prophet Joseph Smith; "Curt H. Seemann, "The Israelite Conquest of Canaan" (read by Edward A. Wheeler); James C. Dean, "Recent Discoveries at Jericho; "Louis J. Nackos, "Judah in the Days of Jeremiah and Lehi; "Einar C. Erickson, "New Dates for the Reign of Zedekiah; "M. Harvey Taylor, "Paul Henning, Early Latter-day Saint Archaeologist;" V. Garth Norman, "The Seven Golden Candlesticks of the Apocalypse (Revelation 1:12); Naomi Woodbury, "On the Origin of the Jaredites;" Carl Hugh Jones, "Small Grains in the Agriculture of Book-of-Mormon Peoples;" Tim M. Tucker, "A Comparative Study of Ancient Mesoamerican and Mesopotamian Temple-Towers; "Welby W. Ricks, "A Purported Phoenician Inscription in New Mexico; "Read H. Putman, "Were the Plates of Mormon of Tumbaga?"; and M. Wells Jakeman, "A Possible Remnant of the Nephites in Ancient Yucatán. "

In addition, a special message from Dr. Howard S. McDonald, who was president of Brigham Young University when the Department and the Society were founded, was read; and one was delivered by Dr. Francis W. Kirkham. Both were present at a meeting of December 17, 1946, when the Department was created (Newsletter, 33.1). Dr. McDonald is an Honorary Member of the Society and has recently been made president of the Salt Lake LDS Temple. Dr. Kirkham

is a Life Member and general officer of the UAS.

Welcoming remarks were delivered by Dr. Ricks, Society president. Dr. Ross T. Christensen, UAS general secretary-treasurer and chairman of the Symposium (Newsletter, 87.12), gave the concluding remarks.

Preparations are going ahead for a complete publication, by Extension Publications of BYU, of the papers delivered at the Symposium. The present plan is to distribute free copies to all members of the Society as soon as it is off the press.
