74.0 THIRTEENTH ANNUAL SYMPOSIUM READY. The program outlining activities for the Society's "Thirteenth Annual Symposium on the Archaeology of the Scriptures" accompanies this issue of the Newsletter.

Since the preliminary announcement in Newsletter, 73. 1, better facilities on the BYU campus have been obtained, and meetings will be held in room 184 of the Jesse Knight Business Building, rather than in the Joseph F. Smith Family Living Center. The time schedule has also been changed to allow for the presentation of more papers. Registration will begin at 8:30 a.m., and the morning meeting will convene at 9:15.

The date of the Symposium is still Saturday, April 1, 1961. Society members are urged to attend and bring their membership cards and Friends.

74.1 EXCAVATIONS BEGUN AT AGUACATAL. The 1961 BYU archaeological expedition has arrived at Aguacatal and excavations have begun, according to word received this week from nearby Ciudad del Carmen, southern Mexico.

According to Dr. M. Wells Jakeman, expedition field director, trenches have been sunk into the Jilon del Aguacate and near Group E, older portions of the ruin which were identified in 1958 (Newsletter 48.01), and a series of previously unknown ruin mounds have been discovered which appear to complete the encirclement of the ancient walled city.

The 1961 expedition is being financed by a bequest in the will of the late Mrs. Zella Lichfield Roberts, a loyal Society member who passed away in 1958 leaving \$5,000 to the UAS (Newsletter 65.1)

Dr. Jakeman will report on the 1961 expedition as the final contribution at the Society's Thirteenth Annual Symposium, to be held on April 1 (see above.)
