## THE ART OF WAR AMONG THE NePHITEs．

$I^{T}$T does not appear，so far as can be gathered from the record， that any vers great improvements，either in the system of fortification，the style of defensive armor，or the manufacture of their weapons，was made hy the Niephite commanders who lived after the days of Noroni．

There is another kisd of defen－ive cluthing，beside plate armor，mentionel as leing worn by the ancient Auerican warriors．It consisted of very＂thick cluthing，＂＊jwsibly made of cottou or mooleu cloth，thickly padded．Noroni uniformed some of his troops in this manaer then lie first took command of the Nephite armic：，（B．（．it）and the next year the lawanites fullowed his eximule amb ont wily prepared themselves with shiels＇s and hreast plates．hut also＂with garments of skins；yea，very thick garment：t，cover their nakednes．＂${ }^{\prime}$
The varinas enemices that the Nephite arnuie had to meet， from time to time，on the field of battle－hamanites，Amulon－ ites，Smalckites，\％／sraites，Gadianton rublecre，etc．－were very llifferently emuipped for their bloody work．Those who had dis－cuted from the Nephites naturally held to the same tactics．used the same arms．and protected their bodies with the same arumer as the people to whom they hat turned trait－ ors．With tise original Lamanites it mas different．At first when they came against the Nephites they merc chathed with ＂a short skin girdle about the loins and their heads haren； and their skill mas in the bow and the cimeter and ：ixc．＂ The dissenters，while armed and equiped like the Nephites， set a mark upon thom selves by which they might be known and distinguishe 1 on the battle fiek．In doing this they nonomediu－ly fulfillen the word of the Jand to their father： Thus，the followers of Amliei，the monhldele king，marke．el themeskea with red in their forelseak after the manner of the lamanites，thongh they did nut shave their heade as did the direct deecendants of laman．（B．（．．©T）．$\ddagger$

Lihen nearly all rable or emi－civili\％ell races，the Lomanites

 and with will orix．ru－hed to the ascault in the hope of hearime down all re－istance hy their superior numbers，as in almont every war they ereatly ontmmbered the Nephites， Ind eel it is doultfin if＂（rom the last－named people used murh seientitic atratery previnus to the days of Woroni；before this time it mas a hand－th－hand ennfliet，wherein the Nephites，
though ferrer in numbers，had many adrantages over their half－naked foes，by reason of superior weapons and defensive armor，and，abore all，through the blessing and guidance of the Lord．

In the sear B．C．i2 the armies of Moruni drove the Lamanites out of that portion of the east wilderness bordering on the land of Carahemla into their own lands．The conntry of the Nephites was ealled the land of Zarahemla，that of the Lamamites the land of Nephi．They were divided by the great wilderness；to the north lay Zarahema，to the south Nephi．The northern line or boundary of the latter country ran＂in a strait course from the sea enst to the rest．＂The Lawanites having been driven out of those nortions of the milderness north of the dividing line，colonies of Nephites were sent to oceupy the country and haild cities on their southern border，even to the Atlantic coast．To protect the new settlers，Mornni placed troops all along this line and caused them to erect fiortifications＊for the better defense of the frontier．This fortified line ran from the west sea（the S＇icific Ocean）ly the head of the river Sidon（the Magdalena） eastward along the Northern cdge of the milderness．Some of the readers of the Book of Mormon have imagined this line of defense to have heen one continuous rampart or wall－ after the style of the great wall of China－－reaching from ocean to ocean，and ou this surmise have argued that the completion of such an immense work，in a few jears．was an impossibility to a people of the limited numerical strength of the Nephites．TTo get over this difficulty of their own ereation they hase resorted to various theories，inconsistent with the gengraphical details，with regrard to its loeality，on purnose to shorten its distance to what they deemed a reason－ ahle length，possible for the Nephites to have built in a few years．The writer of this maper holds the opinion that the Buok of Mormon conveys no such idea，it simply states that Noroni erected fortifications along this line；or，as he views it，Moroui took aldyantage of the natural fatures of the country，its wide rivers，far－stretehing swaups and ranges of hish mountains，and built furtifications at every point where the Lamanites conld fiul ingress，such as at the fords of the rivers and the passe；s letween the momenains．He there stationed bodies of tronps sniliciently strong to hold their posts and，if uccessary，delime the surrouting country．This system of defence would be urore powertul an 1 effective than an artificia！wall；high mountains and deep rivers largely taking the place of carthworks，masoury and heavy timbers． A number of years later（13．（1．：3t）the lamanites having temporarily ariven the Nephites fom the siuthern continent， Morcaihah，the son of Moroni，fortilied the Isthmms of l＇auma firm sea to seat fal in this way prevented the Lamanites from pu－hing jet further norlh．Thhis defensive line wats again furtifie ！ly Mormon（A．W．Bti（）in the last great series of wars between the two races．$\ddagger$
